Voice and Word Choice	<p>I use a style, tone, format, and genre appropriate to the reader.</p> <p>I use a variety of words that highlight my meaning and evoke strong images.</p>	<p>I use a style and tone appropriate to the reader.</p> <p>I use a variety of words that usually highlight my meaning and evoke clear images.</p>	<p>I am not necessarily aware of the reader when I write.</p> <p>I use words that work, but they are not effective in capturing the readers' interest.</p>	<p>I do not take the reader into account.</p> <p>I use everyday language and simple vocabulary to describe or discuss.</p>

Conventions	<p>I write with an excellent command of the conventions of language (spelling, punctuation, capitalization, and grammar).</p> <p>I self-edit, respond positively to peer and teacher review, and willingly revise and rewrite based on feedback.</p>	<p>I write using many of the conventions of language.</p> <p>I revise my writing to make my ideas or organization clearer.
