Intel Anchors Oregon's Economy

Intel's operations in Oregon stretch across six campuses west of Portland in Washington County. The six campuses comprise Intel's largest and most comprehensive site in the world—a global center of semiconductor research and manufacturing and the anchor of Oregon's economy. The company has approximately 15,000 employees in Oregon, making it the state's largest private employer.

Since 1974, when Intel acquired its first property in Oregon, the company's capital investments in the state have topped \$20 billion. Intel is poised to increase that amount significantly, with the upcoming construction of a new development fabrication facility at the site. Intel is the largest property taxpayer in Washington County, with payments of approximately \$28 million a year.

In 2010, Intel was named the "Most Admired Technology Company" in Oregon for the sixth year in a row, based on a survey of 2,500 CEOs and top-level managers throughout the state. In addition, Intel was named Oregon's "Top Manufacturing Company" in 2010, and, for the third time, was recognized as the "Most Philanthropic Company" in Oregon.

Intel in the Community

Through the Intel Involved Matching Grant Program, the Intel Foundation extends the impact of employees' volunteerism by donating cash to qualified schools and nonprofit organizations where Intel employees and retirees volunteer 20 hours or more in a year. Employee service in 2010 resulted in Intel Foundation donations of over \$1.6 million to Oregon schools and nonprofit organizations. Intel also invested \$1.3 million in K-12 education and \$727,000 in higher education in Oregon in 2010.

Intel employees and retirees provide additional support to the community through the annual Intel Community Giving Campaign. The Intel Foundation matches employee campaign gifts up to \$10 million in the U.S. The 2010 campaign in Oregon generated \$6.8 million in contributions to local nonprofit organizations through United Way of the Columbia-Willamette. United Way has recognized Intel with several campaign awards, including Largest Total Employee Giving Campaign, Largest Corporate Gift, and the Campaign Chair Award.
