Dear Judge Poppiti:

After full deliberation, including briefing and hearing, the Court allocated the time among the parties for the depositions of the 6 Dell Witnesses. The time allocated to AMD was less time than it requested and is the minimum amount of time necessary for AMD to elicit the testimony it needs to satisfy its burden of proof regarding the Dell/Intel relationship. Now, after the conclusion of the hearing, having represented to the Court that it only needs 3.5 hours for each witness for its part of the case and receiving 100% of the time it requested, Intel is asking for more time. Any additional time allotted to Intel ought not to come out of AMD's allocated time. If the Court is inclined to now provide Intel with more time, that time should serve to extend the duration of the depositions of each of the Dell witnesses.
